

Appliances have been installed Double commercial refrigerator, single freezer & frig Large triple sink, ice maker, 2 stoves, dish washer, and hand sink




Metal Shelving in the Pantry






Matt's Communion Table Carole & John At Home Communions -**Take on special meanings**
