#### **Oakland's Global Mission**

These basic homes are being constructed in Honduras to replace those lost in last years' hurricanes and mudslides. The homes are 20' x 20' and cost about \$2,500. They include indoor plumbing and an oven, amenities that most Hondurans have never had before. Each family is helping construct its own home and is responsible for finishing its walls. The Outreach Committee and Council has agreed to hep fund one home. We have an anonymous donor who has offered to pay for half a home.
