Beloved,

I once had the opportunity to worship with members of the Vision Church of Chicago. They are an independent Korean church seeking to join the UCC. They had about 25 members in church on that Sunday and the entire service was in Kore an. Despite not understanding a single word, as I sat there I got a "feel" for the sense and spirit of worship. It was an interesting experience because even though there were only a small number in a large sanctuary, the people who came to worship sang like they were a 100 member choir. They sang with gusto ... they sang out ... they sang with spirit and feeling; and as I listened to the singing I felt

there was a real desire to be there ... to sing praise to God ... to join with other Christians to worship God. Even though I couldn't understand what was being said or sung, I could "feel" the spirit and pulse of worship, and it was good, lively, spirited and uplifting. It makes me wonder if people came to our church and didn't know a word of English, what would they "feel?" People who visit our church may make a decision on whether or not they return based (in part) on what they feel, sense and experience from being with us. What would they sense or take away from their time worshipping with us?

Does our church have SPIRIT? I believe that we do, and this summer is the time to let it shine. We will joyfully return to our beloved sanctuary on June 6th. While we have been more than fortunate to have had the wonderful Family Life Center available to us during this past year, I know that many of you are as anxious as I am to be back in the pews. We have been blessed in recent months with a number of visitors, and we may have more as we have been the only UCC church in our Association to be worshipping in person. I believe that folks are anxious to get back to worship. Let's make sure they feel like they are charter members of our church each time they walk in the door. Let's all try our best to be intentional about keeping our SPIRIT of hospitality alive this summer as we invite, receive and care for those who are strangers. Let us offer to all a spiritual home so that they can discover for themselves the unending richness of life in Christ. Let us always be mindful to "not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." (Hebrews 13:2)


