Beloved.

I have been reading a book by Rudolf Meyer entitled <u>The Wisdom of Fairy Tales</u>. It touts that the fairy tale, with all its archetypal images, lives on through all the changes and upheavals in the church. I have recognized so many of you in these classic stories. We have "Little Red Hens", who -- even if no one else wants to work – they will get the job done. Our "Jacks" (from the Beanstalk) help our church climb to new heights. And our "Alices" take us on adventures to discover the wonder of reaching all for Christ.

Our Church Council is made up of all these characters, and they put their very best efforts toward making our church soar. But do you know why else we're going to soar? Because not one person on our Council is "Goldilocks"... that hard-to-please... never-satisfied Goldilocks. "It's too hot. It's too cold. It's too hard. It's too soft." You know Goldilocks, the chronic whiner... rarely -- if ever -- happy. Well, we're all very grateful

that she's not one of us, but I have to admit that there have been times in my life that I could have been called Goldilocks. Here are some of the "fine whines" that I have uncorked, and what I have discovered to be their cures:

Whine #1: "It's impossible!" We often feel like we're hitting a brick wall. On some days, nothing works, and there seems to be no way out of our problems. The Cure: "Anything's possible!" Think about these words: "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26). It's time that we Christians take a bold stand for God. "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31). Dream the impossible, and then ask God for it. All things are possible! Only believe!

Whine #2: "We've never done it that way before!" The sign at the fork in the dirt road reads, "Pick your rut carefully because you'll be in it for the next 40 miles!" The church often gets stuck in ruts because humans, for some reason, distrust change. The Cure: "We have the opportunity to be the first!" After Peter visited the home of the Gentile Cornelius, he was actually confronted by the church board! The early church had never done ministry this way before. Peter responded by saying in Acts 11:16-17, "Then I remembered what the Lord had said... [and] who was I to think that I could oppose God?" When God leads us to new ventures or creative alternatives, we need to step out with the confidence that we're accomplishing God's will. What an exciting adventure we can have when God asks us to take the road less traveled -- or even more exhilarating, to blaze the trail for the first time!

Whine #3: "No one wants to do it!" Defeatist attitudes lead to fatal public relations. If we aren't enthusiastic about ministry opportunities, why in the world would anyone else be? The Cure: "We can do it!" We need to passionately believe that being involved in ministry is the most essential tool for the health of a Christian's spiritual life, for satisfaction with church, and for passion about God. We'll never convince people to serve by being negative. We should never apologize for asking them to get involved in ministry. Let's enthusiastically offer the gift of service because we know that service will bless them.

Here are my final words of wisdom: "fine whines" don't improve with age...they just leave a sour taste in our mouths and in our hearts. So "consider it pure joy...whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything" (James 1:2-4).


