Stained Glass Memorial Windows

We have a long history of moving and refurbishing our beautiful stained glass memorial windows that can be found throughout the church. These

windows have given us much pleasure over the years. In earlier times, church members might have looked at a family window and said, "My great-grandmother used her farm rent money to pay for that window." Today, let's talk about Oakland's windows.

When the little 1872 church was enlarged and remodeled in 1893, a new vestibule was added to the front, 18 to 20 feet were added to the rear, a new roof was put on and new pews were installed. *Also added* were ten single-light Lancet stained glass memorial windows: four on each side and two in front. I call these the A-shaped windows. Believe it or not, nine of them can still be found in the church today: two, in the Community Life Center; two, in the Children's Annex; and five, in the sanctuary area. One window was broken as it was being moved.

The A-shaped windows are not the only stained glass memorial windows in the church. In 1923, our pastor, Dr. I. W. Johnson, led us in a major building program, and in November, 1925, we dedicated this sanctuary with its eleven picture stained glass memorial windows. I call these the arched-shaped windows. There are three large picture windows and eight smaller ones with a small picture or symbol on the upper part of the window. In the large Gayle window, we see the "Good Shepherd" holding a lamb in his arms as "Mama" ewe looks on; then in the window over the altar, we see Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane: You can almost hear Jesus say: "Not my will but thy will be done"; and finally in the Eley window, we see Mary at the Empty Tomb. She hears His voice: "Mary, Mary, do not look for me here." Look at the smaller windows. The Lamp and Book are in the Martin Window, White Lilies in the Copeland window, Open Bible in the Luke window (On a sunny morning, the reflection skips across the wall in front of the Altar.). Last, the Alpha and Omega, God at the beginning and God at the end, in the Crumpler window in the central entrance.

What a legacy our forefathers left us: stained glass memorial windows that tell two stories—the story in the picture window and the story of the family who gave the window.

What Does "Generosity" really include?

Being generous has always been a big part of who and what Oakland is all about. The Bible makes clear that generosity leads to a more abundant life. Generous people experience one of those paradoxes of the Kingdom of God where "the last are first, the greatest is servant to all, and whoever loses her life for Christ will gain it".

The paradox? Generous people get back far more than they give.

First, a clarification: The paradox is **NOT** a financial strategy to maximize return on investment. That would be missing the point. Besides, there are more important things to give than money, such as time, service, kindness, forgiveness, compassion, love, and joy. And what we get back may not be quantifiable. How can one measure wellbeing and happiness?

Generosity's real "payback" is what and who we become when we cultivate a habit of giving in many ways. Giving transforms us into generous-hearted people, and generous-hearted people tend to experience a real abundance of joy, peace, love, and security.

Our financial Stewardship Campaign for 2022 is over, so let us aim to now give away more of our time, to serve our neighbor, to be lavish in compassion, and extravagant in love.

Then let's pray that God will guide each of us and help us experience the paradox: Givers get back more than they give away.
