It has been 9 months since the Search Committee was formed. Thus far, we have received a total of 10 profiles. The volume of profiles has been less than we hoped for but we are confident that, though the process may not be quick, we will find the right fit for Oakland. We have reached out to four candidates and have been able to interview one candidate. The committee was impressed by the candidate we interviewed but are still in the process of receiving profiles and reviewing candidates before proceeding further in our process.

Our search has extended beyond the United Church of Christ and now includes denominations that share privilege of call with the UCC. We have also asked that our profile and job posting be shared at seminaries in surrounding states. We are hopeful that our process continues in a positive manner and that we are able to call Oakland's next Pastor in the near future. We do ask that the congregation continue to keep the committee and the church in your prayers as we navigate this process of discernment.

Church Time Change

Beginning after Labor Day, our worship service will once again take place at 11am. This decision was made by Council at the request of the Board of Christian Education (BOCE). Prior changes to worship have been made by request of the Pastor and in consultation with the Council and Board of Deacon's.

The BOCE has tried for several years to accommodate a Sunday School program around the 10am worship time with little success. Currently, the schedule has one adult class meeting at 9am, younger youth meet during children's church, and an additional adult class occasionally meets following worship.

There were multiple patterns noted by the BOCE which led to our request to the Council. First, there is currently not a time when all members of the family are offered Sunday School at the same time. As a generational church, it is important that we can offer curriculum to the whole family. To meet in the morning before church, 9am was a constant struggle for families with little ones and school aged children to regularly attend. Additionally, meeting after church met with several obstacles. Most notably, the tendency to leave immediately following worship, as well as varied service lengths and post-worship socializing made a start time difficult to nail down.

Returning to the church's historical times appear to offer the most opportunity for success with the Sunday School program. Thus, the BOCE made the request. Council carefully considered and unanimously voted in favor of the change in worship time. Oakland's aim is to provide a spiritual home for all ages and promote multi-generational worship. We appreciate your willingness to help us reaffirm our Sunday School program and continue building our church family by accommodating this change.

Please join us on <u>Sunday, September 11, 2022</u>, for Rally Day activities at 10am including devotionals, introduction of the Sunday School classes, and churchwide Bible Trivia. The following Sunday, September 18, 2022, will mark the first Sunday of our new Sunday School program. The program will include separate classes for youth Pre-K-12th grade and two adult classes—continuing with a Lecture Based class, as well as, offering a revamped discussion based class. Please be on the lookout for more information on the Sunday School classes and opportunities to volunteer in the different programs.

Proposed purchase of a new church sign to replace current sign. Questions answered about the size of the sign and capabilities of new signage. 8-foot-tall x 10 feet wide, 3-foot x 8 foot of this space would be a 5 line

digital message board. It would be hardwired to the church network, church office and any other having the "password" would be able to change/update the information on the new sign. Church sign would "fit in" with the current architecture of the church building. Purchase price \$35,000 with funds to come from the Memorial Fund.
