Prayer is the tool by which we can access our Heavenly Father faster than we can say e-mail me. Jesus spent much time in prayer. There Jesus was in the realm of His Father who directed His life and gave him strength for His tasks. Like Jesus, may our e-mails to God increase; then watch, wait, to see what new things God will do for us and with us.

The tune FOUNDATION is part of the book of melodies published in the This hymn speaks to the faithfulness of God and leads us to our faith in Christ Jesus.

We are so fortunate to have melodies and texted that have stood the test of time and are so rich in theology. Can you imagine what church must have felt like in those days of early America? Most churches did not have instruments such as pump organs or pianos. All the music was sung a cappella (no accompaniment). Because of this, the melodies developed and composed were tuneful and easily sung and remembered.




