Once, I helped Peggy's father, Rev. Bill Grissom do a little touch up work on some of his outbuildings in his backyard, a barn, shed, and ice house.

These buildings had been painted green, barnyard green. The first task was to scrape the old paint off so to get a fresh new coat smoothly painted on. I don't know if anyone else has ever scraped paint, but it's a job, and almost impossible to scrape all of it off. The paint gets into the grain of the wood and there it stays. You can scrape, and scrape, but the green paint won't go away.

While scraping away old paint, I had some thinking and reflection time. I thought about how life experiences become ingrained in us that will remain with us forever. Some which bring warm, pleasant, and happy thoughts. Others, which bring recollection of painful, sorrowful, and tearful periods; it is these that we would like to scrape away, but we can not because they are so ingrained in the fiber of our soul. So, we live with them as they are; or we turn the scraping over to God who in His infinite grace can go far deeper into the grains of our souls than we shall ever do by our efforts.

There is a story of a person who was preparing an old painted wall inside an old building for refinishing. All the old paint was removed except for one small section where the paint had become so ingrained, nothing could get it out. A friend who was an artist painter saw the problem and offered a solution. He could not get the flaw out, so he began where the ingrained spot was and worked from there. When he finished, he had painted a beautiful picture of a deer by using the flawed spot as part of the deer's beautiful head and antlers.

I once more was reminded as I was scraping away the old green paint on those old but worth outbuildings that though there are experiences of life deeply ingrained in my soul. God like the artist painter can make something beautiful of one's life. I also thought again as I mad the final preparation to cover those old buildings with a new coat of green paint, that the good news of Jesus Christ is about getting down to the grain of one's soul and scrapping out what can be cleaned out, taking what is left and making one's life worth to be used for service in the kingdom. Something none of us can do for ourselves.


Metal Raised Bed Boxes assembled and filled with dirt last weekend.
