From the Music Corner: Featuring the Oakland Handbell Choir!



From September to June, Oakland's bell ringers meet each week to put together music as a special treat for the congregation. We are so fortunate to have a 4 octave set of bells and a 3 octave set of hand chimes here at Oakland. Each ringer is generally responsible for 2 notes on the scale as well as the sharp and flat versions of those notes. Sometimes, things can get a little bit crazy with the bell changes that happen!


The bell music looks like a big piano score for right hand and left hand. We separate it out by parts and several ringers "color code" their music with highlighter colors. Ringers have to be able to count and know when their notes fit in the music we are playing. Learning music together is sometimes stressful, sometimes daunting, and yet it is always fun!

I am so grateful for this group who is dedicated to practicing and playing together here at Oakland!


Monday, Oct 10 - Fellowship Hall & Nursery Carpet cleaning - no throughfare until the next day in those areas.


