Hello Church!

How good it is to be writing this to you all! I've been patiently (well, kind of patiently) awaiting the chance to connect with you in this way. There will be much to do as together we begin a new chapter in the journey of Oakland Christian UCC's ministries. In the short term, I'll be going about all the typical new pastor things I need to be doing; and I will look to you all for help. I'll have questions, I'll be listening, and I'll be taking lots of notes...I've already got them started.

Later this month, we begin the season of Lent. As much as we will be enjoying the newness of this time, we certainly don't want to miss out on the ancient traditions of this season and all the gifts it provides.

The purpose of Lent is the preparation for Easter through prayer, repentance of sins, almsgiving, simply living, and self-denial. In Lent, many Christians commit to various types of fasting, as well as giving up certain luxuries. This is done in remembrance of Christ's sacrifices during his 40 days in the desert. Many Christians also add a spiritual discipline, such as reading a daily devotional, praying in a disciplined way, or extra commitment to mission work. All of this, whatever one chooses, should be done with the intention of drawing nearer to God.

I suspect that while I will be incorporating Lenten practices, and the work of a new ministry into my daily life, drawing nearer to God will be a sure thing. Being with good people like you ensures that. I'd like to encourage you to use this unique time in a similar way. I certainly want to provide a listening ear to you all so that I can learn about your families, your hopes, your visions, and your concerns. Additionally, I hope you do that for each other. "Talk amongst yourselves" as is often said. Not to be occupied and distracted, but to stay connected. Share your Lenten practices, ask others if they'd like to join you in them, share your hopes in this time. I promise, you will grow closer to God by doing so.

While Lent can be a heavy season, it is a beautiful and meaningful way to prepare ourselves spiritually for the events of Holy Week. Remain the special wonderful community that you are, and simply welcome me into your midst. It is a special time in my ministry and the life of Oakland Christian UCC, let's enjoy it.

Finally, we will also be learning the intricacies of how to communicate with one another. That can sometimes be very challenging until we get to know our boundaries, comfort zones, preferred methods, etc. I can help by offering you two things:

helped everyone. If it is not an emergency, please hold off on calling between the hours of 8pm and 8am. Of course, please, always get in touch with me in an emergency. I'll also begin using the church Facebook page and you are invited to "like" and "follow" my page Pastor Jason Stump. Now, since that is out of the way, I want to say again how very grateful I am to receive this call from God and Oakland Christian UCC. We have much to do together! Let's get started!


