


GOOD TIDINGS NEWSLETTER OAKLAND CHRISTIAN UCC


My friends, I don't want to at all diminish the joy of Christmas. Personally, I love it and I can't wait to be there. Yet, I must wait, just a bit longer.


pledges and surveys in the Commitment Box.

Thanks again for your faithful contributions to Oakland Christian Church.






