January is often overlooked as being considered a month of significance in Christian life, and living practices. Sandwiched between Advent and Lent, we often forget that the Christmas Season always goes into January. We also have the celebration of Epiphany, also too often overlooked as a significant event on our church calendar.

In some churches the manifestation of Christ to the magi (Gentiles) is celebrated on January 6th, and in others the baptism of Jesus himself is celebrated. Many churches have a "remember your baptism" service. I hope to do that here in the future.

As God is revealed in Christ to the Gentiles when The Magi (Three Kings) meet him, we know that it took a journey for them to arrive there. They followed the star, as we all know.

This year on Epiphany Sunday (January 7th), we will use a growing practice in many churches called "Star Words" to begin our own journey this year. Each person will be randomly given a star with a word on it. We will then learn about ways you can use that word in various practices to grow closer to Christ over the next year.

I highly encourage you to come to this worship, and to commit to this practice. It's simple, easy, and meaningful. It will bring you closer to Jesus.

There's much to be said about beginning a new calendar year, and all that we have to look forward to as we continue our journey as a Christian community. While that all is important, I feel compelled to write simply an invitation to join together in this worship service, and in using each of your individual "Star Words" to journey towards Christ. There's nothing more important than that work as a pastor. I assure you, if you use your "Star Word" in the ways suggested, or in other ways you discover, you will grow close to Christ.

May your journey as a congregation, and as individual disciples of Christ, always lead you closer to Christ.
