Hello Church!

I'm sharing with you a poem written by Malcom Guite in 2020 as he contemplated what it would be like that Easter to not be inside a church building. In words to describe the poem, Malcom wrote, "But, like so many, I am deeply distressed at not being able to gather in church this morning, and to receive communion in community, to meet Christ 'risen in bread, and reveling in wine', as I put it in a sonnet long ago. But this Easter, he calls me to discern him in new ways and in different places. He is risen indeed, and if I cannot go to church then where am I to find him? That is the question my new poem seeks to address, and if it is a question you ask yourselves too, then I hope you will find this poem helpful. "

While difficult, I think it's good to remember those days of pandemic times, and all that we contemplated in our homes, workplaces, communities and The Church. As difficult as those times were, I do believe many of us learned a lot during them. About ourselves, others, and our relationships with God. Both personal and communal.

I'd ask you to read his poem this Easter season and contemplate it both by remembering what 2020 was like, and what it is like for those today who, for a variety of reasons, cannot go to church; or cannot seem to find Christ inside a church building.

I know that it is hard for many of us to understand, but a large portion of our neighbors have not found Christ when looking at Christianity. How might we show them in ways we have not yet considered?

And where is Jesus, this strange Easter day? Not lost in our locked churches, anymore Than he was sealed in that dark sepulchre. The locks are loosed; the stone is rolled away, And he is up and risen, long before, Alive, at large, and making his strong way Into the world he gave his life to save, No need to seek him in his empty grave.

He might have been a wafer in the hands Of priests this day, or music from the lips Of red-robed choristers, instead he slips Away from church, shakes off our linen bands To don his apron with a nurse,: he grips And lifts a stretcher, soothes with gentle hands The frail flesh of the dying, gives them hope, Breathes with the breathless, lends them strength to cope.

On Thursday we applauded, for he came And served us in a thousand names and faces Mopping our sickroom floors and catching traces


Of that corona which was death to him: Good Friday happened in a thousand places

Where Jesus held the helpless, died with them

That they might share his Easter in their need,

Now they are risen with him, risen indeed.

I have always loved the regalness of this Easter hymn! The music was composed by George Frederic Handel for his oratorio, Judas Maccabeus in 1748. Edmond L Budry penned the hymn text we sing in 1904. One of the best parts of our more traditional church is that we embrace the music and words of the past as we also incorporate music of today into our worship to almighty God.


A UCC SUMMER CAMP
