IRA Charitable Rollovers (or Qualified Charitable Distributions)

If you are 70¹/₂ or older and have a traditional IRA, you may give up to \$100,000 to a charitable organization. The gift can satisfy all or in part the annual Required Minimum Distribution (or RMD) without affecting your taxable income. This means the distribution will not affect your Medicare rates or tax rates. Furthermore, you will not need to account for a carry-forward of the deduction on your taxes as would normally happen with large gifts. It is wise to consult your own IRA custodian or financial planner to assist you.

We encourage you to consider an IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (or QCD) to Oakland Christian UCC. You may make a direct charitable gift to our General Fund, or speak with church leadership about other funds and special projects that you may be interested in supporting through your gift.

News From Your Council

John Mitchell informed Council that he will not be seeking reelection as Treasurer next year. We were saddened by this news and express our sincere appreciation for all the hours he has given as Oakland's Treasurer.

We are seeking a church member willing to be our future Treasurer. John reported that he generally spends ten hours a month, plus attendance at council meetings. End-of quarter activities add 5-8 hours, end of the year adds another 10 hours and budget preparation requires extra time.

He would like to have a replacement identified by August so that person can become familiar with all phases of the job including budgeting and year-end closeout. He will be available for consultation as needed after that. The candidate should know or be willing to learn Excel Spreadsheet and QuickBooks. If interested, you might talk to John about the various components of the job. We are asking members to consider their skill set and let our Moderator, Dr. Ralph Howell, know of your interest no later than May 30.

Please note the following job description of Treasurer from our Constitution:

1. The Treasurer shall:

A) Be a member of the church elected annually by the Congregational Conference for a one-year term at the November meeting.

B) Receive and disburse all money contributed to causes represented in the church budget, and such other funds and contributions as the Congregational Conference or Council may determine.

C) Pay all accounts when properly authorized by the Congregational Conference, Council, or Pastor.

D) Make a quarterly financial report available to the Council and Congregational Conference.

E) Submit all accounts and records to the auditing committee annually and at such other times as the Council and Congregational Conference shall direct.

F) Perform other duties as requested by the Congregational Conference and Council.

G) There shall be no limit to the number of years that a member may serve as the Treasurer.
