

As you enter our main sanctuary entrance, you will see a small jar labeled "Be The Change." This is separate from our 5th Sunday Coin Collections, and you might even miss it, but it's still got a huge impact.

Recently, the change gathered from there was passed along to the Coalition Against Poverty in Suffolk to buy 100 bus passes for those who use public transportation and need assistance in accessing it. That's doctor's appointments, grocery shopping, pharmacy trips, job interviews, counseling meetings, and on and on.

Little by little, that small trickle of dropping some coins in a jar gathers into a much larger stream of love that directly meets the needs of many.
