

Church Conference set for Nov. 10

The Church Council has scheduled 2025 elections for Nov. 10 immediately after worship.

The Description of Terms and Responsibilities for Oakland Christian UCC Board and Committee Elected Positions is posted in the Fellowship Hall. The information is also available on the Oakland Christian UCC website in the posted Church Constitution and Bylaws under "About Us – Leadership" at the top of the Home Page.

In accordance with Article XII of the Bylaws approved July 2019, absentee ballots will be accepted: "All members who have been active during the current year via time, talent, or treasure may request an absentee ballot from



the Chair of the Nominating Committee provided the member is going to be out of town or medically unable to attend church the day of voting. Ballots must be turned into the Chair of the Nominating Committee or the Church Secretary before Congregational voting occurs."

CAPS Update — from Dana Mitchell

First of all, THANK YOU for supporting the CAPS annual BBQ fundraiser on Sept. 15. With your volunteer contributions, ticket purchases, and donations, you helped CAPS raise over \$10,914 to help those less fortunate in Suffolk.

Second, the CAPS Night Shelter program will begin shortly in November, after a year "off." I have offered for us to partner with a host church to provide meals. Our dates have not yet been assigned, so stay tuned! In addition, if you would like to assist with transportation and chaperoning at a host church, they have an online signup which I will share.

Lastly, I recently shadowed a CAPS volunteer on a Monday afternoon. In a few short hours, I observed these needs:


- Someone getting out of jail requesting rent for a halfway/boarding house
- Someone who lost a job requesting help for meals (who received Food Lion gift cards)
- Someone needing bus passes to visit the Social Security office and his doctor's office (who received them thanks to Oakland's "Be the Change" collection)
- A survivor of domestic violence asking for advice
- Multiple individuals checking on the status of their requests for financial aid with utilities and rent

What I observed was that their budget of \$6,000 per month could easily be spent

fulfilling applications they receive from clients in only one afternoon and that honestly, they need us!


